Survey Scope & Context


- The survey assessed county performance based on 5 key devolved functions




Methodology & Reliability

Collection Method: Computer-Assisted Telephone Interviews (CATI). This technique involved trained interviewers conducting structured phone interviews using computer software to guide the questionnaire process.


60% Rural Areas

A majority of respondents reside in rural areas. This suggests that rural perspectives and experiences play a major role in shaping the overall insights.




Age Distribution

The survey captured a broad cross-section of age groups, with the majority of respondents falling between 36 and 50 years old. Young adults (18–35) formed a significant portion, reflecting growing political engagement, while older demographics were proportionately represented to ensure balanced insights.




Educational Level



The data shows a diverse range of educational attainment among respondents, with most having completed secondary or tertiary education. This indicates a relatively educated population with varying levels of academic exposure.




Religious Distribution















Are You Happy With What Your Governor Has done in 3years?





Top 5 Happiest Counties










The Least Happiest Counties











Would You Reelect Your Current Governor 2027(First-Term Governors)






